

The 2-year Post-Graduate Diploma in Management (AICTE approved) is designed to prepare students for careers in industry, across functional areas. The Programme equips students with strong conceptual skills to manage businesses in an integrated manner.

The emphasis is on developing a holistic manager with a vision to take on the challenges of the future.

Objectives

- To build awareness about the socio-economic environment, both domestic & international and its implications for businesses
- To hone analytical and problem-solving skills using modern day managerial tools to enhance decision making capabilities
- To impart state-of-the-art skills and knowledge in functional areas of management with the objective of preparing students for cross-functional roles in industry
- To develop the students & personality, integrated with strong values and positive attitude to be receptive to societal concerns and ethical conduct

Curriculum

The course for the PGDM Programme is spread over six trimesters, each trimester being 11-12 weeks. The first three trimesters are essentially devoted to foundation courses, across core areas of management. Based on the feedback of all the stakeholders these courses are aimed at providing the student a conceptual understanding of the functional areas such as:

- Basic areas, e.g. Economics and Organizational Behavior
- Techniques, e.g. Statistics and Research Methods
- Functional areas, e.g. Marketing and Finance
- Integrative areas, e.g. Strategy and International Business
- Technology, e.g. Management Information Systems

Elective Courses

Courses in the 2nd year are designed to offer students an opportunity to pursue their interests in various functional areas. Students will thus have an opportunity to specialize in the functional area of their interest. A student can specialize in more than one area, the areas being Marketing, Finance, Organizational Behavior & Human Resource Management, Decision Sciences & Operations, Information Management & Analytics, and Strategy. A student also has an opportunity to pursue a Course of Independent Study (CIS) in lieu of an elective, to further his/her interest in a particular area, subject to meeting the conditions specified for the purpose and reviewed from time to time. Summer Internship

On completion of the first year, the students gain hands-on experience in the application of core concepts and functional skills through a Summer Project with leading Corporate Firms. This practice of 'Learning by Doing' helps the students to relate the rigor of theory to the world of business. They work on projects as per the specifications of the company. At the end of 8-10 weeks of a closely guided project under the supervision of a company executive, the students submit a report to the company. Our students have also received Pre-Placement Offers (PPOs) for their exemplary work during their internship.

Pedagogy

The faculty at IMI Bhubaneswar enjoys academic freedom to adopt appropriate pedagogy for imparting education. Pedagogy would be a combination of lectures, case discussions, presentations, assignments and project work. The primary emphasis would be on interactive and participative methods of learning. Faculty for the Programme comprises of the core faculty at Bhubaneswar campus as well as faculty from IMI Delhi and Adjunct or Visiting faculty. Guest lectures from industry practitioners are also organized to expose students to the current business environment and practices.

Admission Process



Eligibility for admission

To be eligible for admission to the PGDM Program, the participants must possess a Bachelor's degree or equivalent, with a minimum of 50% aggregate marks or equivalent in any discipline, recognized by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) for admission to post-graduate programs. The bachelor's degree or equivalent qualification obtained by the candidate must entail a minimum of three years education after completing higher secondary schooling under the 10+2 system or equivalent. The applicants to the programme are selected on the basis of IMI Selection Index score calculated based on the past academic performance in 10th, 12th, and graduation; CAT/XAT/GMAT/CMAT score; written test; essay writing; group discussion; extempore, and personal interview. Appropriate weightage is given to work experience of the applicants.

Categories of Applicants

Self-Sponsored Candidates: The bulk of the applicants are self-sponsored candidates. They are either fresh graduates or have worked for a few years and joined after quitting their jobs. The Institute's placement cell provides them placement assistance on the best effort basis.

Foreign Nationals

International Management Institute (IMI) Bhubaneswar invites applications from students belonging to foreign countries desirous of pursuing 2- year Post Graduate Diploma in Management (PGDM).

Selection Process

Students are shortlisted on the basis of:

PROGRAMME DURATION

The FPM at IMI Bhubaneswar is a four-year programme which can be extendable by 1 year. However, in case of exceptional circumstances, the programme may further be extended twice by 1 year duration, subject to approval by competent authorities.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The programme is offered in the following two modes:

- Residential programme
- Non-residential programme

Students under residential programme will be required to be present physically on campus throughout the programme.

The programme is divided into two phases. The first phase requires the scholar to undertake course work. On completion of the course work, the students will be required to take a Comprehensive Examination (CE). The CE is based on a scholar's chosen area of interest. The purpose of CE is to provide scholars with an opportunity to identify their area of research interest and build sound background knowledge for their dissertations. During the second phase, scholars are expected to work on their doctoral thesis. The award of FPM at the end of the second phase requires the scholar to prepare a thesis proposal, pursue research based on the approved proposal under the guidance of the faculty supervisor, and finally, defend the thesis before the research committee.

*** Seminar paper should be in line with the research work of the candidate and should focus on the initial research framework. The modus operandis of Seminar Paper will be provided in the Area Elective Courses in Term III. The student will be required to take four electives from his/her area of specialization. Instead of opting for an elective course in the area, a student can also work on a Course of Independent Study (CIS) under a faculty member. If a student decides to work on the CIS, the same will be considered an elective course.*

The students will be required to prepare the seminar paper and the paper based on the review of literature as a part of their coursework. These papers would be presented in the in-house monthly research seminar and should be of publishable quality. The student is required to appear for the Comprehensive Exam (CE) at the end of the course, and on successful completion, they will commence work on their thesis.

1. Background

International Management Institute, Bhubaneswar is an educational institution established by the named International Management Institute, India. The society is registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860 has set campuses in New Delhi and Bhubaneswar with the objective of improving the quality of management thought and practice through wide ranging activities in education, training and consultancy relating to management, governance, development and other related areas.

2. Basis of accounting

- i. The financial statements of the Institute have been prepared according to Indian generally accepted accounting principal including the Accounting Standards issued by Institute of Chartered Accountants of India under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis.
- ii. Expenses on library books are charged in income and expenditure account in the year of purchase.
- iii. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are consistent with those of previous year. All the amounts included in the financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees ('Rupees' or 'Rs' or 'INR'), unless otherwise stated.

2.1 Significant accounting policies

A. The financial statements of the Society have been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI). The following accounting standards mentioned below are not applicable to Society for the current year as it is under Level III.

- a. AS 3 – Cash Flow Statement
- b. AS 17 – Segment reporting
- c. AS 20 – Earning Per Share
- d. AS 21 – Consolidated Financial Statements
- e. AS 23 – Accounting for investment in associates in consolidated financial statements
- f. AS 25 – Interim Financial Reporting
- g. AS 27 – Financial reporting of interest in joint ventures

B. Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires the management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities and the disclosures of contingent liabilities, at the end of reporting period. Although these estimates are based on the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future periods.

C. Fixed Assets

- i. Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost comprises the purchase price and any directly attributable cost of bringing the asset in its working condition for its intended use. Borrowing costs relating to acquisition of fixed assets which takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.
- ii. Gains or losses arising from de-recognition of fixed assets are measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and are recognized in the income and expenditure account when the asset is de-recognized.

D. Depreciation

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Written Down Value Method in the manner and at the rates mentioned in Income Tax Act, 1961 on pro-rata basis from the date when it is first put to use. No depreciation is charged in the year of sale / disposal.

If an asset is used for less than 180 days during the period, depreciation is charged at 50% of the normal rate; if an asset is used for 180 days or more, depreciation is charged at 100% of the normal rate in respect of addition during the year.

E. Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash and bank and in hand and short term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

F. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Institute and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Revenue from Post Graduate Programme Fees and Hostel Fees: Revenue is recognized ratably over the period of the course and accordingly 10% of current year fee is rolled over to next year and previous year 10% is added to current year fee.

Revenue from Application Processing Fee: Revenue is recognized in the year of receipt.

Revenue from Certificate Programme Fee and Research and Consultancy: Revenue is recognized as per terms of the relevant agreements when the service under the agreement is completed or substantially completed under Completed Service Contract Method.

Interest Income: Revenue is recognized on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable

G. Retirement Benefits

- i) Retirement benefits in the form of Provident Fund are a defined contribution scheme and contribution is charged to the Income and Expenditure Account of the year when the contribution to the provident fund is due. There is no other obligation other than the contribution payable to the Provident Fund.
- ii) Gratuity is a defined benefit obligation and is provided for on the basis of an actuarial valuation on projected unit credit method made at the end of each financial year.
- iii) Encashable Short term compensated absences are provided for based on estimates. Long term compensated absences are provided for based on actuarial valuation. The actuarial valuation is done as per projected unit credit method.
- iv) Actuarial gains/losses are immediately taken to income and expenditure account and are not deferred.

H. Foreign Currency Transactions

i) Initial recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

ii) Conversion

Foreign currency monetary items are retranslated using the exchange rate prevailing at the reporting date. Non-monetary items which are measured in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency, are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction. Non-monetary items which are measured at fair value or other similar valuation denominated in a foreign currency, are translated using the exchange rate at the date when such value was determined.

Receipts in foreign currency are translated at the rates applicable on the date of the transactions.

iii) Exchange differences

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items, or on reporting such monetary items of IMI at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year, or reported in previous financial statements, are recognized as income or as expenses in the year in which they arise.

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items not covered above, or on reporting such monetary items of IMI at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year, or reported in previous financial statements, are recognized as income or as expenses in the year in which they arise.

I. Alumni Funds

Alumni funds include alumni-life membership fees collected by society as a part of fees. These funds are utilized as and when alumni meet happen.

J. Membership Fee

Associate and Life Membership Fees and Donations received are carried forward in the accounts under the 'Corpus Fund'. The Life Membership fee receipts are accounted for on cash basis in the absence of any formal commitment/contract with the members.

K. Government Grants

Government Grants related to revenue are recognized in the Income and Expenditure Account over the periods necessary to match them with the related costs

L. Borrowing Cost

Borrowing cost includes interest and amortization of ancillary costs incurred in connection with the arrangement of borrowings.

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use or sale are capitalized as part of the cost of the respective asset. All other borrowing costs are expensed in the period they occur

M. Leases

Where the Institute is the lessee

Leases where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased term, are classified as operating leases. Operating lease payments are recognized as an expense in the Income and Expenditure Account on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

N. Provisions

A provision is recognized when the Institute has a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions except those disclosed elsewhere in the financial statements, are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on best management estimate required to settle the obligation at each Balance Sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and are adjusted to reflect the current best management estimates.





17. Best Practices adopted

IMI Bhubaneswar has a rich resource pool of quality full time members who have contributed towards adoption of various unique practices in order to improve the quality of education at IMI and make the students industry-ready. In order to facilitate improvement in teaching and learning, following key initiatives have been taken.

1. In a major revamp of programme curriculum, all core courses offered to PGDM students have been converted into two credit courses that require 20 hours of classroom interaction. A course - restructuring committee was constituted comprising of faculty members. This committee took into consideration the AICTE criteria for core and elective courses credit requirements. Accordingly, it recommended optimization of credits for core courses. Subsequently the matter was deliberated upon in the Faculty Council and approved upon. Feedback was also sought from the experts during the curriculum revision meetings held at Area level. All these courses were earlier of 3 credit requiring 30 hours of class-room interaction. The major objective behind this was to provide more opportunity to students to engage in self-learning. A greater thrust was laid on self-preparation.
2. In order to provide students with deeper knowledge on emerging streams, Information Management & Marketing Analytics was created as a sub-area to offer all analytics related functional courses such as Marketing Analytics, Financial Analytics, HR Analytics, Data visualization, Web and social media analytics etc. In keeping with this new format, Business Analytics was converted into a core course that is not being taught before the students proceed for summer internship. This was done to provide students with greater analytical skills prior to their industry exposure during summer internship.
3. Marketing Strategy has been introduced in the 3rd Trimester. It is being taught using Markstrat simulation. The students are divided into different teams and they execute their marketing strategies on the simulation platform. The effectiveness of their strategy is reflected in the share prices of the company. The group with the highest share price wins the game at the end of the term. Parallely, students are debriefed by the faculty regarding their strategies and its impact on share prices. This hands-on training to students is aimed at getting the student market-ready before they venture out for their summer internship.
4. For Finance area, Bloomberg terminals and PROWESS database have been installed in the library so that students can have ready access to financial data. Accordingly, the Finance courses have been modified so as to provide an opportunity to students to use real-time data for their financial decisions.
5. The institution has a laid down policy of permitting 20% of total sessions in every course to be taught by experts from corporate and academia. This enables importing of important industry insight and exposes the students to some real-world dilemmas.
