# RECORD NOTES OF THE XXVIII MEETING OF THE SCHEME STEERING COMMITTEE (SSC) OF SFURTI CHAIRED BY SECRETARY (MSME) ON 21<sup>st</sup> JANUARY, 2019

- 1. The list of participants is annexed.
- **2.** Director (ARI) welcomed the participants to the meeting, after which the agenda points were taken up for consideration.
- 3. Agenda Item No.1: Confirmation of Minutes of the 27<sup>th</sup> meeting of the SSC:

Minutes of the 27<sup>th</sup> meeting of the SSC held on 12.09.2018 were noted and confirmed.

**4. Agenda Item No.2:** <u>Action taken report on the decisions taken in the 27<sup>th</sup> meeting of the SSC:</u>

As per the directions of the last SSC, all Nodal Agencies were asked to review the progress and ensure timely operationalization of the clusters.

5. Agenda Item No.3: Status of SFURTI Clusters:

Director (ARI) presented a snapshot of the 111 [72+39] approved projects under SFURTI and the progress made by each of the Nodal Agencies till date. Out of the total approved amount of Rs.206 crore, an amount of Rs.150.60 crore has been released to various Nodal Agencies. 41Clusters are functional/operational in the country and 4 more are to become operational by the end of February 2019. Further, it was submitted that as per the mandate of the National Bamboo Mission, 25 bamboo-based clusters have to be set up under SFURTI. Also, Ministry of MSME has a mandate to reach out to the 117 Aspirational Districts, and, therefore, special care has been taken to bring credible proposals from these districts under SFURTI.

- 6. Agenda Item No.4: To consider for final approval of 34 DPRs received from IIEG (8), KVIC (4), Coir Board (6), IED Odisha (12) and IMEDF (4):
  - I) Final approval of DPRs: A brief snapshot of each proposal is given below:

#### A. KVIC

(i) The DPR of Gangoh Bee-keeping Cluster, Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh, was presented. It was submitted by the Technical Agency (TA) that the rich flora of the area provides enabling agro-climatic conditions for honey bee rearing and honey production. It was advised that value added products in honey need to

be taken up under the project for higher value addition and returns. The SSC examined the proposal and found it suitable for intervention under SFURTI. Accordingly, the SSC has approved the proposal.

- (ii) The DPR of Chitoor Tamarind Cluster, Andhra Pradesh, was presented. This intervention through SFURTI is an attempt to bring the existing artisans into the value chain so as to provide them an opportunity to improve and diversify the product and also raise the marketability of products. The cluster caters to artisans exclusively belonging to Scheduled Castes. The SSC has approved the proposal.
- (iii) The Dantewada Herbal Cluster is a unique attempt to reach out to the substantial tribal population involved with the collection and processing of various traditional herbal products in the region. It is one of the proposals received from the Aspirational District from Chhattisgarh State. The cluster caters to artisans exclusively belonging to Scheduled Tribes. The SSC has approved the proposal.
- (iv) The Farukkabad Potato Processing Cluster is an attempt to provide an agricommodity-based processing cluster at the countryside close to the production base so as to enable the farmers to realize their full potential. Secretary, MSME, urged the TA to increase the coverage by enrolling more number of artisans into the cluster. The SSC has approved the proposal with a direction to increase the artisan base to 500.

#### B. Coir Board:

(v) The DPR of Kongu Coir Cluster, Erode, Tamil Nadu, was presented. On examination of the proposal, it was found that the corresponding projection of growth, due to the proposed intervention in terms of investment, appeared to be very incremental. Consequently, the SSC didn't recommend the proposal for investment under SFURTI. Coir Board, the Nodal Agency, was asked to examine the proposal in detail from the point of view of investment and corresponding creation of value in terms of productivity, earnings and income for the artisans, and to re-submit all the six similar proposals in the next meeting of SSC. Consequently, all the six proposals were deferred for re-submission to the SSC in the next meeting.

#### C. IIE Guwahati:

(vi) The DPR of Bechimari Bamboo Cluster, Darrang, Assam, was presented. Examination of this proposal as well as other similar proposals presented by IIE Guwahati revealed that none of the proposals has met the requirements of land and formation of SPV. Consequently, Secretary, MSME, has advised IIE, Guwahati, to examine the proposals afresh and to tie-up the loose ends with special focus on finalization of land, formation of SPV and enrolling more number of artisans per cluster. Consequently, all the eight proposals submitted by IIE, Guwahati, were deferred for re-submission to the SSC in the next meeting.

#### D. IEDO:

- (vii) The DPR of Dhanakera Applique Cluster was presented. Secretary, MSME, urged the TA to increase the coverage by enrolling more number of artisans into the cluster. Examination of the proposal revealed discrepancies in terms of outcomes due to project interventions. Consequently, the proposal was deferred for re-submission to SSC with appropriate modifications.
- (viii) The DPR of Bahugram Jute Cluster was presented. Secretary, MSME, urged the TA to increase the coverage by enrolling more number of artisans into the cluster. Examination of the proposal revealed discrepancies in terms of outcomes due to project interventions. Consequently, the proposal was deferred for re-submission to SSC with appropriate modifications.
- (ix) The DPR of Maniabandha Handloom Cluster, Cuttack was presented. As the SSC found that the construction cost appeared to be on the higher side to the tune of 39% of the Hard Intervention, the same was rationalized. Similarly, the cost under Soft Intervention was also rationalized from Rs.22.18 lakh to Rs.20.36lakh, in view of the high cost of exposure visits. The SSC has approved the proposal with the above-mentioned changes along with a direction to increase the number of artisans in the cluster and to link up to institutional buyers in the State and outside.
- (x) The DPR of Berhampur Handloom Cluster, Ganjam, was presented. All the 300 artisans presently covered in the cluster are women. The proposed component of Market outlet estimated at Rs.7.5lakh is not supported as per guidelines. Further, under the Hard Intervention, the proposed costs pertaining to accessories like furniture& fixtures, showcase, computer & printers, table

&chairs costing Rs.83 lakh are completely off the shelf for an artisan cluster. The cost under Soft Intervention has also been rationalized from Rs.17.25 lakh to Rs.12.25lakh, as international exposure visits costing Rs.5 lakh appears to be inconsequential and hence cannot be supported. The SSC has approved the proposal with the above-mentioned modifications and with directions to increase the number of artisans in the cluster to 500 (which the IA has agreed) and to introduce latest designs and colours to make the products attractive.

- (xi) The DPR of Brahmagiri Aquaculture Cluster, Puri, was presented. Though this proposal was discussed several times earlier, the twin issues of land lease and SPV were discussed again. The IA submitted that SPV has been formally registered, but the State Govt. of Odisha has not yet provided the land. Further, as recommended by the SSC, the NA has approached a national-level institution like Central Institute of Brackish water Aquatics (CIBA) for formal engagement. The NA further submitted that the details of the cluster in terms of various technical inputs/instruments have been examined and vetted by CIBA, and the institute has submitted a letter of intent for signing a MoU with the SPV. Further, the Secretary, Fisheries, Govt. of Odisha and the District Magistrate have convened meetings, and the minutes were also placed before the SSC. As the construction cost appeared to be on the higher side to the tune of 40% of the Hard Intervention, it has been rationalized. Further, the land development cost of Rs.10 lakh could not be supported as per guidelines. The SSC approved the project with the above-mentioned modifications and with the condition that the land deed from the State Govt, has to be produced before transfer of funds.
- (xii) The DPR of Baripada Bamboo Cluster has been presented. The proposal is one of the dedicated bamboo clusters under National Bamboo Mission. The Market outlet worth Rs.9.80lakh is not supported as per guidelines. Further, cost under Hard Intervention to a tune of Rs. 17 lakh for charcoal kiln & electricity provision was found on the higher side, and hence it has been rationalized to Rs.9.88lakh. The cost under the Soft Intervention has also been rationalized from Rs.25 lakh to Rs.21lakh, in view of the high cost of exposure visits. The SSC has approved the proposal with the above-mentioned modifications and with a direction to link up the cluster to institutional buyers in the State and outside.

- (xiii) The DPR of Nayagarh Bamboo Cluster was presented. The proposal was one of the dedicated bamboo clusters under National Bamboo Mission. The Market outlet estimated at Rs.12.50lakh is not supported as per guidelines. The cost under the Soft Intervention has been rationalized from Rs.18 lakh to Rs.16lakh, in view of the high cost of exposure visits. The SSC has approved the proposal with the above-mentioned modifications and with directions to increase the number of artisans to 500 in the cluster and to link up to institutional buyers in the State and outside.
- (xiv) The DPR of Dhenkanal Bamboo Cluster was presented. The proposal was one of the dedicated bamboo clusters under National Bamboo Mission. The district in which the cluster is located is one of the 117 Aspirational Districts. The proposed Market outlet estimated at Rs.4.25 lakh is not supported as per guidelines. Further, costs under Hard Intervention, such as contingency & other fixed assets are very high at Rs.9.30lakh, and hence cannot be supported. Moreover, land development cost of Rs.5 lakh could not be supported as per guidelines. Under Machinery cost, Electricity provision cost of Rs.8lakh was found high and hence it has been rationalized to Rs.4 lakh. The Bore well cost of Rs.1.5lakh, Transporting cost of Rs.4.45 lakh and Insurance cost of Rs.0.89lakh cannot be supported, and hence they have also been rationalized. Further, the cost under Soft Intervention has been rationalized from Rs.19.60 lakh to Rs.15.60lakh, in view of high training cost. The SSC has approved the proposal with the above-mentioned modifications and with directions to increase the number of artisans in the cluster to 500 and to link up the cluster to institutional buyers in the State and outside.
- (xv) The DPR of Bhawanipatna Bamboo Cluster, Kalahandi, was presented. The proposal was one of the dedicated bamboo clusters under National Bamboo Mission. The district in which the cluster is located is also one of the 117 Aspirational Districts. The proposed Market outlet estimated at Rs.6.62 lakh is not supported as per guidelines. Further, cost under Hard Intervention such as charcoal kiln & electricity provision estimated at Rs.6lakh is high, and hence it has been rationalized to Rs.4.87lakh. The cost under the Soft Intervention has also been rationalized from Rs.18.34 lakh to Rs.14.34lakh, in view of high cost of exposure visits. The SSC has approved the proposal with the abovementioned modifications along with directions to increase the number of artisans in the cluster to 500 and to link up to institutional buyers in the State and outside.

- (xvi) The DPR of Sinapali Handloom Cluster, Nuapada, was presented. The district in which the cluster is located is also one of the 117 Aspirational Districts. Land development cost of Rs.5 lakh could not be supported as per guidelines. Further, costs under Hard Intervention such as contingency & other fixed assets are very high at Rs.9.37lakh, and hence cannot be supported. Under Machinery cost, Electricity provision, transformer & cabling cost of Rs.11 lakh was found high and hence rationalized to Rs.2lakh; Bore well cost of Rs.1.5lakh, Transporting cost, Insurance cost cannot be supported, and hence rationalized. The cost under the Soft Intervention has also been rationalized from Rs.25 lakh to Rs.20.50lakh, in view of high training cost. The SSC has approved the proposal with the above-mentioned modifications along with a direction to link up to institutional buyers in the State and outside.
- (xvii) The DPR of Khariapadar Woodcraft Cluster, Kalahandi, was presented. The district in which the cluster is located is also one of the 117 Aspirational Districts. It was also observed that no sales outlet could be approved under the Scheme, as guidelines do not permit for the same. There was incoherence between the amount of funding sought and the proposed increase in the artisan income and turnover of the cluster. Consequently, the SSC has deferred the proposal with a direction to re-submit the DPR with all the revisions suggested by the SSC.

- (xviii) The DPR of Mangalgiri Gold Jewellery Cluster, Guntur, Andhra Pradesh, was presented. The SSC appreciated the involvement of 1017 artisans in the cluster. The SSC also emphasized the importance of 'Hallmarking & Testing Centre' to ensure quality and purity of the products of the cluster. The SSC has approved the proposal.
- (xix) The DPR of Shivmoga Natural Dyed Handloom Cluster, Karnataka, was presented. Secretary, MSME, instructed the NA to ensure amalgamation of new designs and patterns in to the existing weaving and dyeing. The SSC has approved the proposal.
- (xx) The DPR of Tapi Bamboo Cluster, Gujarat, was presented. This will be one of the 25 bamboo based proposals to be set up under National Bamboo Mission mandate for Ministry of MSME. The SSC has approved the proposal.
- (xxi) The DPR of Roorkee Nautical Artifacts Cluster, Roorkee, Uttarakhand, was presented. The cost of generator worth Rs.11.80lakh cannot be supported as per guidelines. The SSC has approved the proposal with the above-mentioned modification.

- 7. Agenda Item No.5: To consider for final approval of 18 DSRs received from IEDO (11), IMEDF (4) and NIMSME (3): The SSC recommended all the 18 DSRs for converting into DPRs, and directed to present the same in the next SSC meeting.
- 8. Agenda Item No.6: Change of assistance under head 'SFURTI' and also Technical Agency (TA) in respect of 'Bhograi Coir Cluster' at Bhograi, Distt. Balasore, Odisha: The Committee considered and approved the proposal for revision of the earlier approved assistance from Rs.150.34lakh to Rs.198.74 lakh with a direction to increase the number of artisans to at least 750 from the existing 559. The request for change of TA as M/s. ITCOT Consultancy and Services Ltd., Chennai has been acceded to.
- 9. Agenda Item No.7: Change of assistance under head 'SFURTI' in respect of 'Tarapur Coir Cluster' at Tarapur, Distt. Anand, Gujarat: The Committee considered and approved the proposal for revision of the earlier approved assistance from Rs.247.84 lakh to Rs.246.18 lakh, as there was a typo-error in the final minutes.
- 10. Agenda No.8: Any other matters with the permission of the Chair.
  - A. Secretary, MSME, emphasized the importance of setting up clusters for bringing economies of scale to production and for creating national and international value chain. Secretary, MSME, has also given certain specific directions as follows to all concerned:
    - i. All Nodal Agencies, while presenting the proposal, must provide the break up of the project hard intervention in detail;
    - ii. The contribution of Technical Agencies must be evaluated to find out the best performing agencies;

- iii. KVIC to make a list of all crafts, arts, activities and traditional methods adopted across the country with proper mapping of artisans;
- iv. Every product must come with a unique story for attracting customers in the highend markets;
- v. Peer review by clusters must be encouraged for cross learning and knowledge sharing;
- vi. Independent experts must be encouraged to visit clusters and to perform gap analysis;
- vii. All Nodal Agencies must make sincere efforts to visit all the clusters under their intervention and submit reports within one month.
- B. The Chairman SSC advised that a full-fledged third party evaluation of the clusters be conducted and the outcomes be placed before the SSC. The study would bring out the actual difficulties, challenges and potential course correction, which is to be adopted for faster grounding of projects, for providing market linkages and for exploring the export potential of the clusters.
- C. All Nodal Agencies must endorse the proposals presented before the SSC and take ownership of the claims of higher production, turnover and increase in wages. Further, it must be ensured that no information should be concealed from the SSC or not provided through the DPR. Moreover, Nodal Agency must fully satisfy itself that techno-economic feasibility of the cluster has been properly done before submitting the same to SSC. Nodal Agency, in consultation with the Technical Agency, must make all efforts to make the cluster a success.
- D. As far as the tardy progress of implementation of carpet weaving cluster in Mirzapur, Uttar Pradesh, is concerned, KVIC presented the action taken in this regard, and SSC approved the action of KVIC to change the IA with immediate effect. The SSC has also instructed to ensure that the same IA may not be entertained for any other proposal in future.
- E. All clusters focusing on introducing best practices in terms of technology introduction and also ensuring market access through innovative means may be preferred for selection.
- F. All 117 Aspirational Districts, North Eastern Region and SC/ST dominated districts must be targeted to take up clusters on priority by all the Nodal Agencies.

- G. Presentation of the DPRs should be crisp, focused and without any factual errors, and the NA must check the same before presenting to the SSC.
- H. All Implementing Agencies and Technical Agencies that are non-serious in implementing the duly approved projects by the SSC should be put on notice, and all the Nodal Agencies must make efforts to seek alternative IA/TA in the larger interest of artisans.
